- (5) In the case of a health care professional who is a 967 physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice registered 968 nurse, both of the following apply: 969
- (a) The professional may provide telehealth services to a 970 patient located outside of this state if permitted by the laws of 971 the state in which the patient is located. 972
- (b) The professional may provide telehealth services through 973 the use of medical devices that enable remote monitoring, 974 including such activities as monitoring a patient's blood 975 pressure, heart rate, or glucose level. 976
- (D) When a patient has consented to receiving telehealth 977 978 services, the health care professional who provides those services is not liable in damages under any claim made on the basis that 979 the services do not meet the same standard of care that would 980

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apply if the services were provided in-person.

(E)(1) A health care professional providing telehealth services shall not charge a patient or a health plan issuer covering telehealth services under section 3902.30 of the Revised Code any of the following: a facility fee, an origination fee, or any fee associated with the cost of the equipment used at the provider site to provide telehealth services.

A health care professional providing telehealth services may charge a health plan issuer for durable medical equipment used at a patient or client site. (2) A health care professional may negotiate with a health plan issuer to establish a reimbursement rate for fees associated with the administrative costs incurred in providing telehealth services as long as a patient is not responsible for any portion of the fee.

(3) A health care professional providing telehealth services shall obtain a patient's consent before billing for the cost of providing the services, but the requirement to do so applies only once.

(F) Nothing in this section limits or otherwise affects any other provision of the Revised Code that requires a health care professional who is not a physician to practice under the supervision of, in collaboration with, in consultation with, or pursuant to the referral of another health care professional.

(G) It is the intent of the general assembly, through the amendments to this section, to expand access to and investment in telehealth services in this state in congruence with the expansion and investment in telehealth services made during the COVID-19 pandemic."
